(b) Catch, deflect or bat a rebound from an unsuccessful shot at goal

(c) Momentarily signal for a pass or to indicate the intended direction of a pass

22. **Contact and Contest**

When attacking, defending or playing the ball, opposing players may come into physical contact with each other.

Describe contest.

Provided the players do not interfere with each other's play or use their bodies to gain an unfair advantage over their opponent it is deemed to be 'contest' and play continues

23. Explain 2 of the 3 ways that a player **MAY** gain possession of the ball.

To gain possession of the ball a player may -

(2 marks)

(a) Catch the ball with one or both hands

(b) Roll the ball to oneself

(c) Catch the ball if it rebounds from the goalpost
